


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QTY	DETAILS
1m	Wash away Stabilizer
	USB stick / iPad to save design
	Janome embroidery thread - sample stitched with 264 Green + bobbin with the same thread
	Janome Needle - to suit project
	Container of hot water, Lego Blocks / square of wood, Non-Stick Baking paper
	Chop Stick / tweezers
	Pins, Scissors, Hand Sewing Needle

Janome Skyline S9 Embroidery / Sewing Machine with 'F2' Open Toe Satin Stitch Foot, 'P' Embroidery Foot, SQ14a Hoop, Magnetic Clips

INSTRUCTIONS

1. Download the embroidery design and save to the iPad or USB. Open the design to the sew out screen on the embroidery machine.
2. Attach the 'P' Embroidery Foot to the machine and insert a new Janome needle for embroidery.
3. Thread the machine with the bobbin and embroidery thread matching.

4. Hoop a double layer of stabilizer into the SQ14a hoop. Attach the magnetic clips to the edges of the hoop to help support the stabilizer while embroidering.
5. Attach the hoop to the embroidery machine and stitch out the design.
6. Re-hoop the stabilizer so that a repeat can be embroidered.
7. Repeat the above steps until there are 5 embroidered pieces.
8. Remove from the hoop and trim back the excess stabilizer.
9. Select the switch to sewing mode icon  and change to sewing mode.
10. Select from the satin stitch menu stitch #16.  16
11. Adjust the stitch width to 5mm and attach the 'F2' Open Toe Satin Stitch foot. 
12. Lay the 5 blocks out to create a cross with one central block that the remaining 4 connect to.
13. Working around the central block stitch the sections where the outer blocks connect to the central block using the sewing machine satin stitch.
14. Fold the side blocks up to create a 'box'. Hand stitch the sides sections together working around the 'box' shape.
15. Submerge the embroidered lace into hot water to dissolve the stabilizer. Keep in mind that the Tealight Holder will still need to have stabilizer remaining in it to hold its shape so don't leave the lace submerged for a long period of time otherwise the holder will become flat.
16. Remove from the water with a chop stick or tweezers making sure to not burn yourself.
17. Place upside down on the non-stick paper with a Lego block inside (to retain shape) while the embroidered lace dries.
Note: If you would like more or less shape to your holder this is the time to adjust before it dries.
18. Allow the lace to completely dry for approx. 12+ hours.
19. Insert your battery operated candle and your holder is complete.
