

Janome MC15000 with SQ23 hoop, SQ14 hoop, 'F2' Open Toe Satin Stitch Foot, 'A' Standard Foot, Acufeed Foot, QC Freemotion Foot, 'P' Embroidery Foot, USB / iPad to transfer designs

LILYPAD LEAVES

1. Trace the leaf templates, on the fold, to create full leaf shapes (See page 6)
2. Trace around the templates onto the non-fusible side of interfacing, leave 3cm space between templates.
You will need the following:
 - 3 x Leaf A
 - 5 x Leaf B
 - 7 x Leaf C
 - 5 x Leaf D
3. Cut around the leaf shapes approx. 1.5cm outside the drawn lines
4. Place the fusible side of the interfacing down onto the right side of a piece of green fabric & pin




Embroidery Designs




- Select straight stitch and stitch on the line, around the leaf shape, with a stitch length of 1.8mm (Sewing Applications > Seaming > Curve)
- Trim seam allowance to 5-6mm
- Snip into the point and around the outside curved seam, making sure not to cut the stitches
- Cut a 10cm slit in the fusible and turn right sides out



- Press the edges with the fusible side down on a silicon pressing mat
NOTE: The silicon mat protects your iron and ironing board.
- Using the layout image as a guide, fuse the leaves to the background fabric



- Applique into position using Applique Stitch 05



NUMBER CIRCLE BLOCKS

1. Hoop the fabric and stabiliser. Load the embroidery design on the machine from the downloaded file
2. Thread the machine with thread to match the applique fabric colour
3. Stitch out the applique placement line
4. Lay the number applique fabric over the placement line and hold into place with washi tape
5. Stitch the tack down line




6. Select the move hoop icon  and move the hoop forward and trim the fabric back to the tacking line
7. Stitch the satin stitch border



8. Continue stitching the rest of the design changing thread colours as needed
9. Remove from hoop and remove stabiliser



10. Trim seam allowance (SA) to 1.5cm away from the outer satin stitch border
11. Trace the Wadding Template onto the double sided fusible wadding and cut out (10 circles will be required) (See page 6)
12. Centre the fusible wadding on the back of the and embroidery and lay the silicon mat on top
13. Fuse the wadding into position
NOTE: For more protection, always lay the silicon mat over the fusible wadding when applying the iron.



14. Fuse over the SA onto the wadding using just the tip of the iron, making sure not to touch the fusing glue with the iron. **NOTE:** For more protection, always lay the silicon mat over the fusible wadding when applying the iron.



15. Repeat steps 1—14 for the remaining Number Blocks

16. Lay out the Number Blocks in sequence, as per the picture and fuse onto the quilt

17. Applique the blocks into position using Applique Stitch 05 a small blanket stitch in the same thread colour as the satin stitch border



QUILT CONSTRUCTION





1. Baste the quilt top, wadding and backing together using your preferred method
2. Attach the AcuFeed Flex dual feed foot and thread the machine with blue quilting thread to match the background
3. Stitch around the outside of all the leaves and numbers
4. Quilt wavy lines along the length of the quilt in the blue background sections. Use the walking foot and while stitching, move the quilt left and right to form the waves.
5. Free motion quilt the leaves as desired
6. Leave the Number Circle Blocks unquilted
7. Trim excess wadding / backing and bind edges using preferred method



FROG CUSHION

1. Hoop up tearaway stabiliser. Load the embroidery design on the machine from the downloaded file
2. Stitch the placement line
3. Lay the fabric onto the stabiliser covering the line right sides up
4. Stitch out the frog embroidery design changing colours when needed
5. **STOP** before sewing the last colour change [Colour 13]



6. Lay the other blue square of fabric over the embroidery right sides down
7. Change to blue sewing thread on the top
8. Stitch the final step (triple stitch)
9. Remove from the hoop and tearaway excess stabiliser
10. Trim the SA to 1.5cm outside the triple stitch line
11. Turn the pillow right side out and fill the pillow with rice
12. Hand or machine stitch the opening closed
